 - \rightarrow celebrating the achievements of children and young people with SEND





• we will offer families training and a better choice of support groups and activities



 we will make sure people get support as soon as possible





Support children and young people to do well in learning and to lead healthy and happy lives

We will

 support schools to work together so that they can help support children and young people



 support peer learning programmes – this is where students support each other



keep children and young people safe



 offer information and training to support good mental health



 support people moving from one school or service to another



 make sure there are enough activities for children of all ages

 make health support and therapies easier to access



 have support available in Camden so you don't have to travel outside Camden for help

 share information about what choices young people have after they leave school



 help young people find jobs by sharing job opportunities and helpful information



 work more closely with local employers so young people can find work in Camden



 support young people to become independent by helping them to develop life skills and by giving advice about housing options



 offer more activities that will help young people access lifelong learning
